National Drug Policy 2023-2033

Key Principles:

- Public Health First: Prevention, treatment and recovery.
- Human Rights and Dignity: Support for vulnerable groups, with non-punitive approaches.
- Evidence-Informed: Policies shaped by reliable data.
- Balanced Approach: Integration of supply reduction (enforcement) and demand reduction (prevention/treatment/recovery).

Strategic Priorities:

- Prevention & Education: Promote healthy lifestyles, especially among youth.
- Treatment & Rehabilitation: Expand access and improve quality of care.
- Harm Reduction: Support safer practices and reduce overdose risks.
- Monitoring & Research: Strengthen data systems.
- International Cooperation: Align with and contribute to EU and UN drug policy framework.



National Drugs and Addictions Unit

Key Functions:

- Acts as a central hub for monitoring, reporting and analysing drug trends in Malta.
- Gathers national data and submits annual reports to the Maltese Government, EUDA, and UN.
- Ensures scientific independence and alignment with UN and EU standards.
- Represents Malta within the Reitox Network, contributing to EU wide discussions and strategies.
- Engages with the Council of Europe (Pompidou Group), United Nations (CND), European Union (HDG)

Outcome:

Evidence-based foundation for national policy development.

Informs strategic reforms in law enforcement, prevention, treatment and recovery.



From Data to Policy

Key Role of Data Collection:

- Accurate, reliable and scientific data on:
 - Prevalence of drug use and problematic use
 - Drug Markets
 - Emerging substances
 - Prevention and treatment effectiveness
 - Law enforcement and harm reduction efforts
- Annual reports inform policy and strategic direction.
- Supports resource allocation, identifies gaps and measures outcomes.

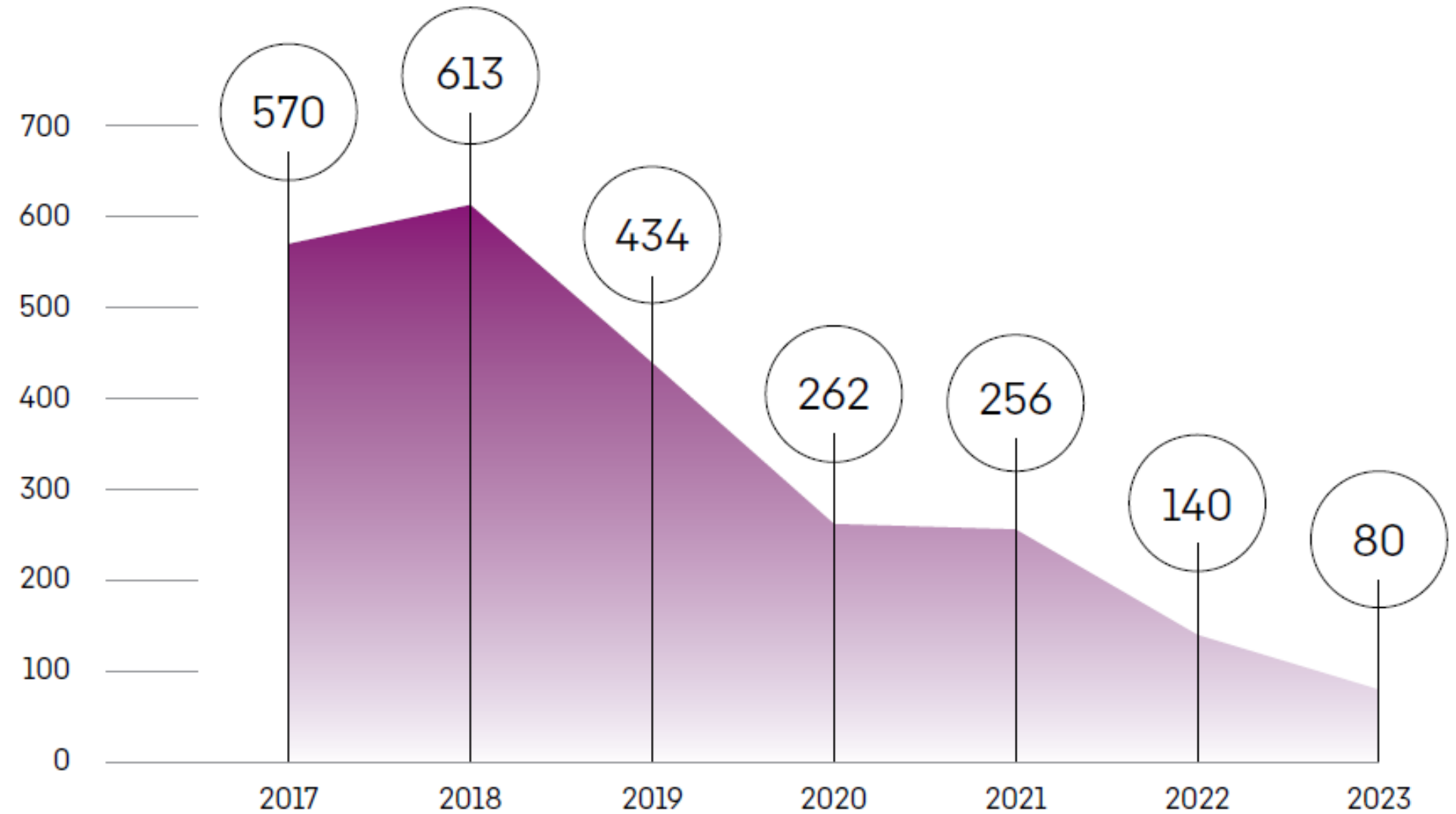

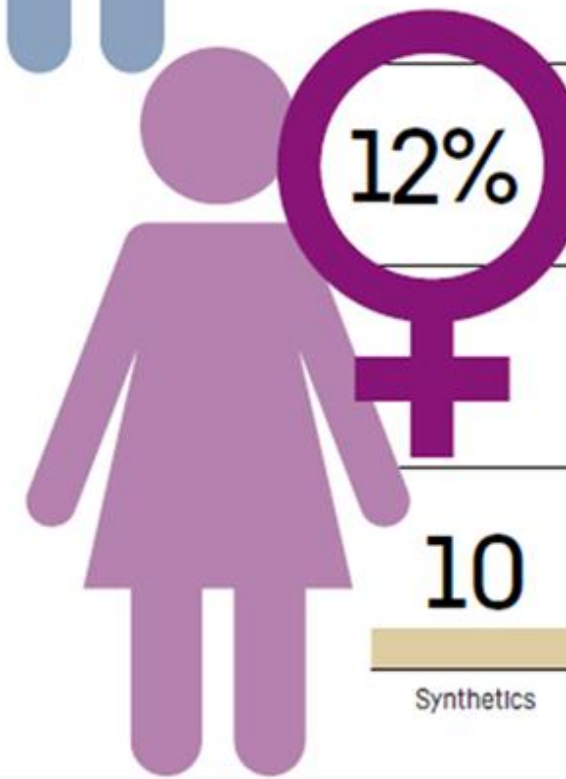

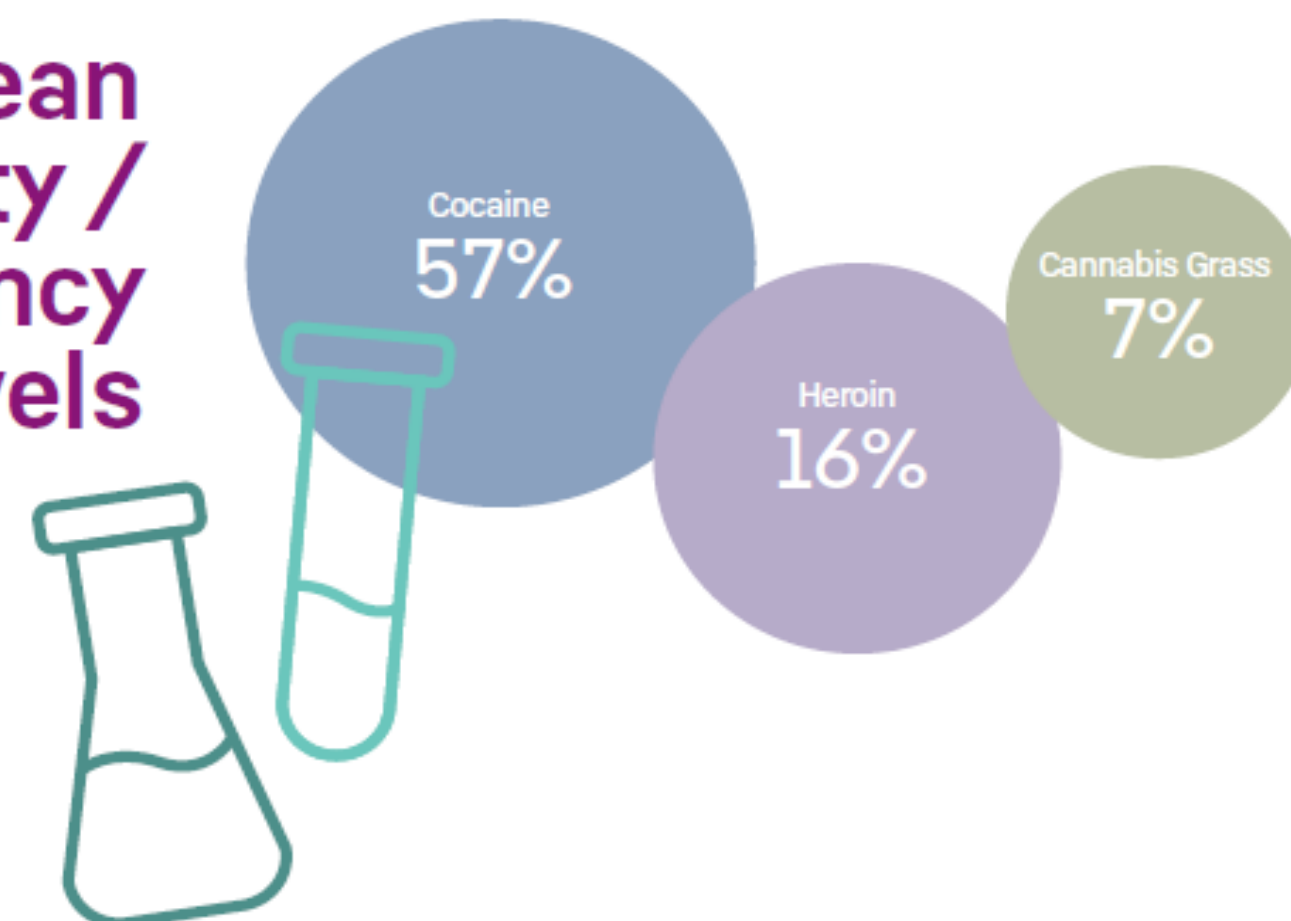

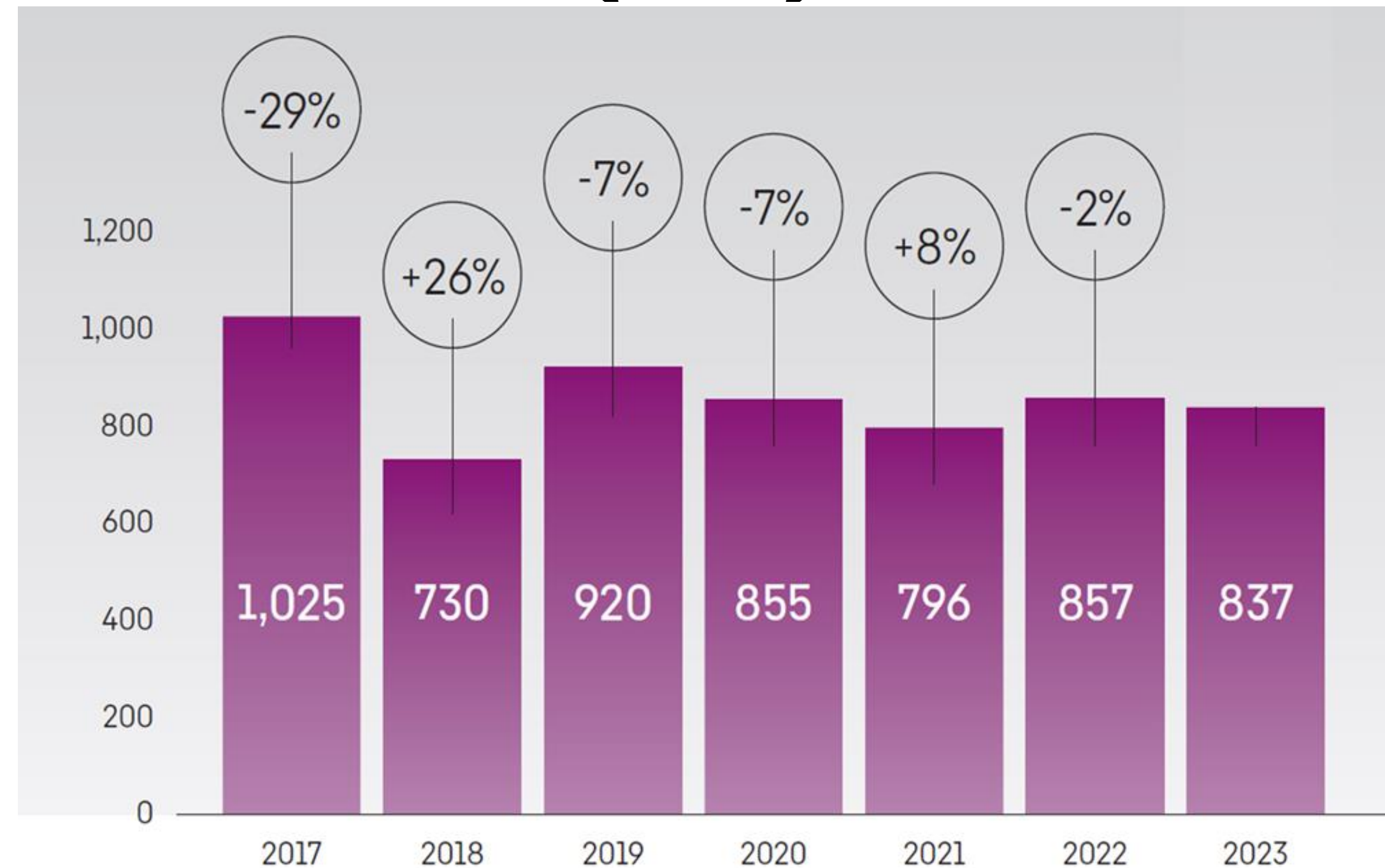
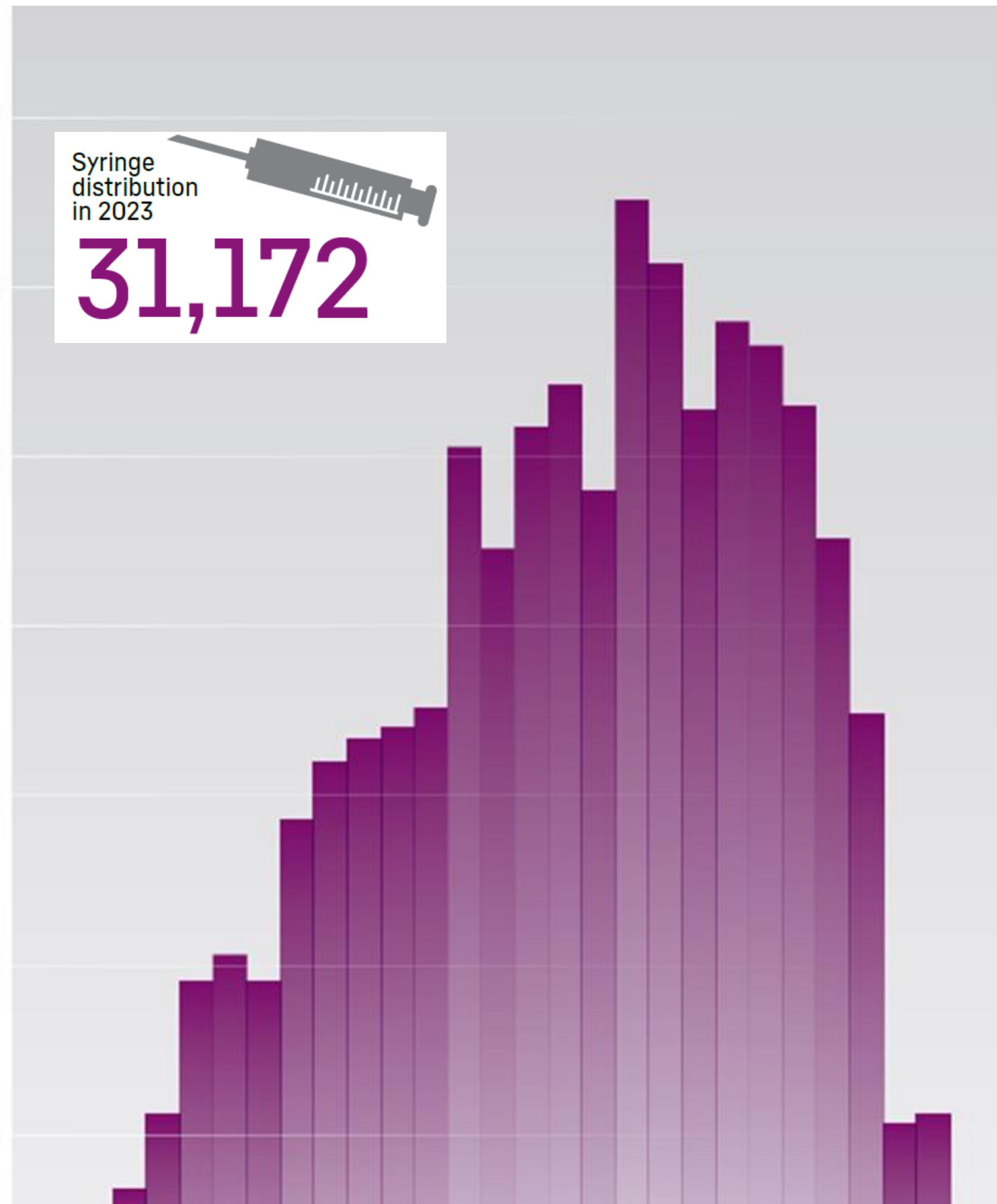


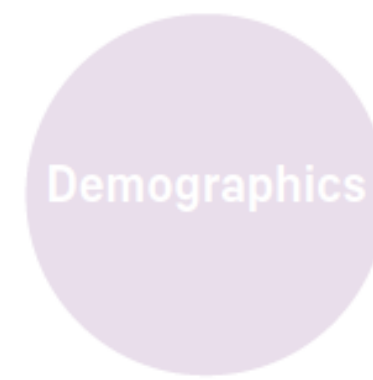


Syringe Distribution 1994-2023

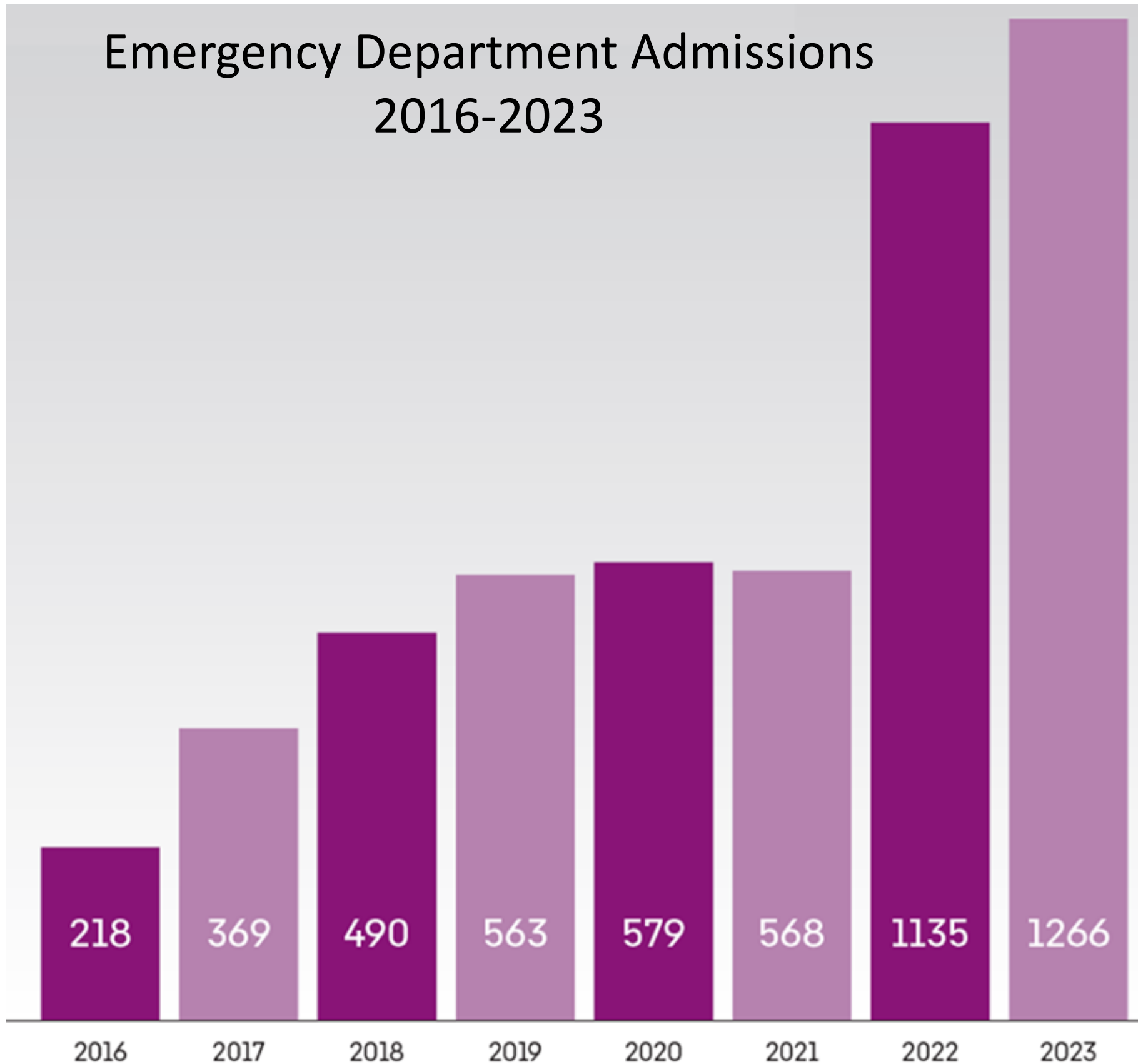


Opioid Agonist Treatment (OAT)





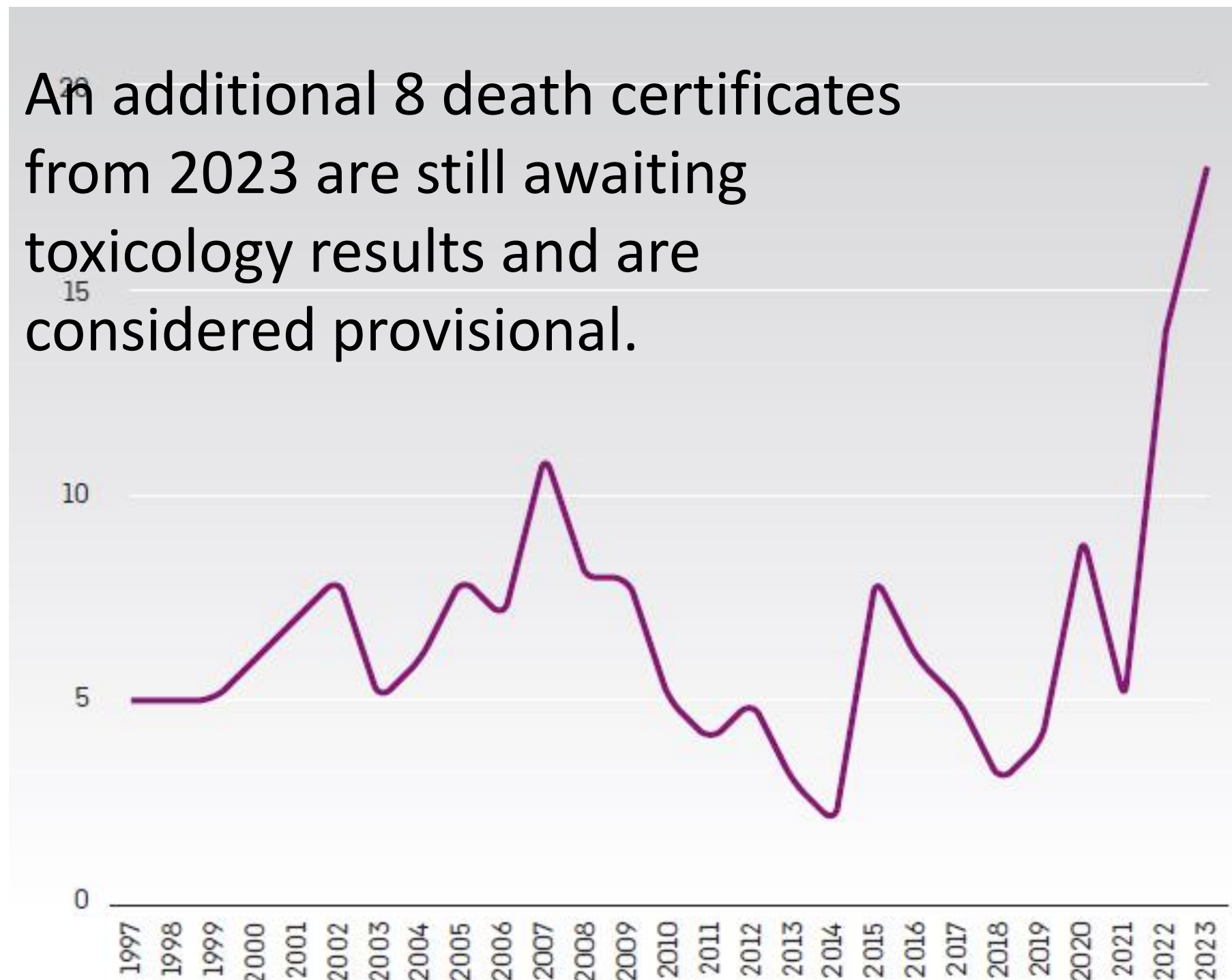
Emergency Department Admissions 2016-2023

National Drugs and Addictions Unit

Future Direction - National Addictions Advisory Board

- Establish a Prevention Coordination Body to enhance national prevention efforts.
- Create a Law Enforcement Coordination Body to improve inter-agency collaboration.
- Launch an Early Warning System to flag high-purity drugs & emerging threats.
- Establish task forces & stakeholder working groups to tackle complex issues (e.g. culture of drug use, homeless clients, drug related mortality, foreign nationals).
