




## INCREASE IN TREATMENT DEMAND





# COURT TRIBUNAL FOR SIMPLE POSSESSION


Fewer arraignments & court referrals

Possibly enabling normalisation of use



## DRUG RELATED ARRAIGNMENTS



#### SEIZURES - BLACK MARKET

Decriminalising personal possession reduced arraignments, but steady cannabis seizures and large postal imports suggest a nonetheless active black market.




## THE NORMALISATION OF DRUG-USE

A recent Times Talk episode by the Times of Malta shed light on the growing visibility and casual use of cocaine in Malta's nightlife, especially in Valletta.

Journalists observed signs of use in nearly every other bar, with individuals queuing for restrooms while openly handling plastic bags of white powder, some even snorting it in plain sight.

This reflects not only the persistence of the black market but also the increasing normalisation of cocaine use alongside cannabis.

## DRUG POTENCY



#### DRUG POTENCY

The potency of drugs available on the local market has increased significantly.

- Cocaine purity has risen from 18% to between 20-30%, making it stronger and potentially more addictive.
- Ecstasy pills are now more potent than in previous years.
- Cannabis potency has increased, with some strains reaching 15% THC content, often delivered through postal services.

### **NEW & DANGEROUS DRUGS**

Molly, Pink cocaine / 2CB, Ketamine / Tusy, CC9. CC9 linked to acute hospital cases in 2025.



#### A GAME OF RUSSIAN ROULETTE

A major danger in today's drug market is that users often don't know what they're taking due to adulteration, raising the risk of overdose or severe health complications, especially with synthetic and high-potency drugs.

# ACCESSIBILITY & LEGAL LOOPHOLES

Drug accessibility has drastically increased through online platforms. Despite a 2024 ban on HHC and related cannabinoids, products such as CC9 continue to appear in shops and online, raising concerns after seven hospitalisations were linked to them in April 2025.

Caritas Malta remains concerned about mislabeled cannabis edibles sold online and in shops, marketed "for research purposes only", or "not for human consumption - which contain THC levels far above safe limits and remain unregulated by health authorities.

# MEDICINAL CANNABIS-BASED PRODUCTS

#### Findings from research done in April 2023:

- Availability of oils is limited on the islands | Dried flowers are mostly available
- Pricing (as at April 2023):
  - Aphria 22/I (5 grams) €60
  - Aurora 22/1 (10 grams) €120
  - Bediol (5 grams) €60
  - Bedrocan (5 grams) €65
  - Cannabis IA 18/1 (10 grams) €70
  - Carbasi Verde 18.6/1 (5 grams) €57
  - o Carbasi Verde 18.6/1 (15 grams) €150
  - Pedanios 20/1 (10 grams) €164.95
  - Pedanios 22/1 (10 grams) €164.95
- The cheapest price is of €70 for 10 grams i.e. €7/gram (Cannabis IA - 18% THC).

# CALL FOR ACTION: I I RECOMMENDATIONS

To decelerate and revert the Normalisation of Substance Use, enhance supply and demand reduction strategies while making our communities safer and healthier

# CARITAS PROPOSALS DEMAND REDUCTION - PRIMARY PREVENTION & RESEARCH

- I. Nationwide media awareness campaigns with a special focus on cannabis and cocaine with full facts and risks associated with use:
  - TV; Radio; Social Media
  - Avoid commercials and campaigns that inform regarding cannabis legislation without mentioning associated risks of cannabis
- 2. Survery on Nationwide use. It does not appear that we have a baseline study on use of Cannabis pre and post the 2021 setting the Law for establishment of the Authority for the responsible use of cannabis.

# CARITAS PROPOSALS SUPPLY REDUCTION -

- 3. Effective enforcement of Cannabis Legislation especially public consumption
  - 1. Public Use Remains Rampant "A Law that is not enforced is like no law"
- 4. Prohibiting the advertising of "Grow Shops" and "Low THC 0.2% products". Prohibiting them from opening in the vicinity of school; youth hubs and sports centres.
- 5. Remove off the shelves and off online portals low 0.2% THC products, HHC products and edibles with other synthentic substances that are wrongly labelled not for human consumption or for "in-vitro" research purposes

# CARITAS PROPOSALS SUPPLY REDUCTION -

- 6. Prohibit home-growing in households where there are children residing to ensure child safety
- 7. Register home-growers with ARUC for greater visibility and accountability
- 8. Regulate seeds and THC limits in low THC edibles

# CARITAS PROPOSALS SUPPLY REDUCTION -

#### 9. Mandatory drug-driving tests

- I. the police are already equipped with Subsidiary Legislation 65.16, regarding Breath Tests Regulations, which provides a legal framework to test drivers under the influence of alcohol. Such legislation considers a refusal for breathalyser tests as an assumption of guilt. In the current scenario, any drug test for drivers can only be done with the consent of the individual involved, in which case a person who is under the influence of drugs and driving can refuse to give consent.
- 2. Introduce alcohol and drug testing in motor vehicle accidents that involve grievous bodily harm

10. Do Not allow Harm Reduction Social Clubs to have members consume cannabis on premises unless:

- There is real enforcement of the prohibition of public consumption
- 2. Home-growing is abolished especially in the case where children reside in the household.

II. Service Delivery Gap – A Low Threshold Residential Service for persons who are dependent on substances, homeless and show low readiness for residential rehabilitation
